How Encamp excels

EMIS apps only license general regulatory content and don't automate data imports from state or federal databases. Also while consultants are able to do this legwork, paying them adds up.

Integrate workflow and calculations

Workflow:

Get state fields from the EPA, NOAA, and all 50 states before fields are made available in public state portals. Our intuitive dashboard also makes any workflow easy for all users to understand — including alerts and reminders for assigned tasks in each facility.

Calculations:

Confirm all threshold planning quantities (TPQs) for a state level, including extremely hazardous substances (EHSs). Encamp automatically selects if you're under a reporting threshold for a given chemical or even an entire facility.

How Encamp excels

EMIS apps work well for incident reporting, determining EHSs, and checking TPQs at the federal level, but not for states. Everything else? They offer you “modules.” But you still have to configure and populate the system yourself, meaning it's only as smart as you make it.

How Encamp excels

Some EMIS companies offer consulting services — at \$400/hour, or more — to submit compliance reports and pay filing fees for you. Most other EMIS vendors don't do submissions at all.

You're on your own for record keeping, too. While EMIS apps all offer an “available” digital filing cabinet — essentially basic cloud storage — you must still organize records and data yourself.

If you manually submit your own reports, good luck navigating the portals in different states... and pushing a check request through accounting before the filing deadline to pay the filing fee. And unless you have an audit trail internally, cross your fingers that reports get submitted correctly.
